The Palaeontological Society of India mourns the sad passing away of two eminent palaeontologists.

Professor H.M. Bolli, Emeritus professor at the University of Zürich, passed away on October 5, 2007 at the ripe old age of 90. Born and educated at Zürich, he was a perfect gentleman besides being an eminent scientist. Prof. Bolli was known for his extensive work on Cretaceous and Tertiary planktic and benthic foraminifera. The society expresses its deep sense of gratitude for his help in reviewing the papers submitted for publication in the Journal of the Palaeontological Society of India.

Professor Roger Leroy Kaesler, professor of Geology at the University of Kansas, died on August 11, 2007, after prolonged illness. Dr. Kaesler received master's and doctoral degrees from Kansas University. He was associated with *Paleontological Contributions* of KU and *Treatise on Invertebrate Paleontology* as editor from 1982 to 2006 and was known for his landmark works on statistical analysis on fossils. He was a member of the editorial board of the Journal of the Palaeontological Society of India.
